The Aloha Foundation is a Vermont-based non-profit that provides summer camps, family camps and education programs emphasizing simplicity, the outdoors and living in community.

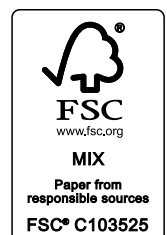

Nonprofits' annual reports are supposed to be serious documents presenting year-end financial results, acknowledging the donors and volunteers who helped to achieve them, and highlighting some of the year's notable organizational activities and accomplishments. Can a comic book (some call them "graphic novels" these days) help do all that? After reading The Aloha Foundation's 2010 Annual Report—right-side up and up-side down—we hope you'll think so.

Camps are famously great places for stories, and the camps and programs of The Aloha Foundation generate a whole lot of them. A few months ago, the Foundation's lively, ever-evolving "blog" (blog.alohafoundation.org) featured a suspenseful, true story about Sarah, a 2010 camper. People who've read the story have commented on how clearly it embodies some of the most important, enduring and distinctive values and practices we champion at the Aloha camps. It also exemplifies nicely the rewards of educated risk taking and persistence in the face of failure—"grace under pressure," Hemingway called it—a personal quality we endeavor to foster here in Fairlee, with remarkable success.

Rendered here in whimsical form, Sarah's tale of fire-building determination nonetheless speaks seriously for itself. So, in their more conventional way, do the facts and figures on the accounting side of this yearbook. Taken together, Sarah's account and an accounting of 2010 performance of the Foundation demonstrate what a resolute community we are at the Alohas, creative and tenacious in marshaling the resources necessary to stoke our camps' fires—and keep them burning.

The Aloha Foundation's strictly-business record for 2010 reflects our fire-keeping commitment, figuratively at least. We served greater numbers of campers and other program participants than in 2009—itself a very good year—and provided more campership support than ever before. Operating revenues and donor giving increased as expenses were managed carefully, yielding a healthy surplus to carry forward into 2011.

The essential business of the Alohas, of course, has much more to do with enabling youngsters like fifteen year-old Sarah to meet challenges of their own, whether unanticipated or self-imposed. She was determined to achieve the high rank of "Vagabond" in camp craft, at Aloha Camp. That, she knew, would require weeks of learning and preparation toward a single, ultimate test—building and burning a "one-log fire." Sarah's display of grace under pressure demonstrates quite literally why we believe the camps and programs of The Aloha Foundation are matchless.

President-Elect's Message John Herrick, Jr.



The beautiful story of Sarah, an Aloha camper in 2010, as told in a posting on the Foundation's blog, contains a phrase that in many ways tells the story of The Aloha Foundation itself: "There are many lessons at Aloha, and some of them aren't easy. Like what to do when things are hard. What it means to invest fully in something that may not work out. Or how to recover from disappointment."

The year was 1967. A group of devoted camp parents had come to Fairlee for Show Weekend. They had just learned that the remaining members of the founding Gulick family were planning to close the camps and sell off the property after their retirement in just a few short years. Bound and determined not to see this happen, this ad hoc group quickly coalesced around the idea of forming a non-profit foundation to purchase the camps and continue their legacy.

And so in 1968, The Aloha Foundation was born. The early years were filled with challenges and adversity. Money had to be raised, staff hired and non-profit status obtained. Diverse opinions about how to run the camps sprouted and clashed from all corners of the Aloha family. The economic malaise of the 1970s tested the limits of an already cash-strapped organization in its infancy. Failure was imminent with every turning year.

Those of us privileged to lead the organization today can't begin to fathom the deep commitment and personal sacrifices made by those who preceded us in those early years. Today we are blessed with strong enrollments, solid financials, a deep bench of highly trained staff and the seemingly bottomless support of countless alumni, parents and friends. A unity of purpose transcends our programs and we have the luxury of thoughtfully planning for the future.

But just like Sarah, The Aloha Foundation has had to learn its lessons over the years, many of them not easy. Its founders and those who followed had to know what to do when things were hard and how to recover from many disappointments. Most importantly, they chose to invest in something that may never have worked out. But just as Sarah was rewarded for her courage, so too are we for the courage of our founders.

Please join me in thanking Sally Reid, my predecessor, for her extraordinary leadership. While things may be a bit easier today than they were back in the Foundation's formative years, each trustee still makes a deep commitment and heartfelt personal sacrifice to help lead this wonderful organization. Sally stands tall among us as one who has left The Aloha Foundation an even better place than she found it.

I remember seeing Sarah that day, after she made her first attempt at the one-log fire. Of course, I saw disappointment clouding her face and tears in her eyes as she contemplated her failed effort. But I also saw something else. I saw her standing tall and presenting a graceful, positive attitude. She wasn't crumbling. She wasn't angry, defensive or blaming. Sarah had a choice that day—to give in to her disappointment and give up, or instead, figure out a new way to pursue her dream of becoming a Vagabond. Happily, Sarah made the decision we were all hoping she would and she ultimately succeeded in attaining her rank. As I joined the whooping and clapping for Sarah when she earned her Vagabond, I realized I was mostly celebrating the life lessons—perseverance, commitment, learning from mistakes—which I believe she gained from the experience.

Recently, I was at a social gathering where I did not know many people. I found myself chatting with a woman who asked me what I do for work. Instead of my typical reply, I tried a new response: “My work is to help girls and teens grow up to be caring, competent, confident women.” Instead of the glazed expression I sometimes get when I say I am a summer camp director, she was intrigued, and asked the big follow up question... “How do you do that?” I went on to tell her the story of Sarah and the one-log fire. She was quiet for a few moments when I finished speaking. Then she looked me in the eye and said, “I wish I had been lucky enough to go to your camp when I was young.”

I think she got the idea of what we really do.





Aloha Hive Kathy Plunkett



With The Aloha Foundation's emphasis on Success Counseling, this is how I imagine a first time Hiver coping with a bit of disappointment.

As Jenny and her parents pull into Aloha Hive for her first camp summer, I know that so many questions and worries swim through her head: she wonders about many things, including whether she will make friends, be homesick, like the food, and if her counselor will be nice and fun. Before she knows it however, Jenny is walking up into the tent field, her new home away from home, chatting with her counselor and tent mates. No matter what her concerns were, at this point, Jenny's first Hive summer is about to start! Mom and Dad say a quick and cheerful goodbye, and Jenny looks a bit nervous, knowing that she is facing seven weeks without her parents' advice and guidance about what to do and how to do it! I know from lots of experience that Jenny will be fine, and might even surprise herself at what she can do and how proud she'll feel about herself.

That first day, Jenny realizes that she is not on her own at all. So many counselors and campers are ready to help her navigate her fears and concerns: learning Hive's campus, coping with homesickness, being nervous to try new things, and finding her special place in this new summer community. Jenny's new counselor and tent mates are a great source of support in those first few days. They spend a lot of time together, becoming each other's first and best friends. After a few days, Jenny is a bit disappointed that her tentmates don't like swimming and canoeing as much as she does, and sometimes Jenny goes to gymnastics with them because she is afraid to go to other activities alone. Jenny writes her parents a letter in the first few days, when she is feeling a bit sad, and I know they are concerned about her. After the first week though, Jenny is surprised that as she goes through her day, she meets other wonderful counselors and girls, who end up being close friends, and who like what she likes to do. Jenny's new friendships and skills allow her to feel confident about settling into her Hive summer. Her parents are relieved, and also impressed with Jenny's achievements.

At the end of the summer, Jenny realizes that even though she sometimes wished that the girls in her tent could have been her best friends all summer, she had a lot of fun meeting other girls. And she felt proud being a little bit brave, without her parents around to make her feel better in tough situations. When school starts in September, Jenny's best friends might not be in her classroom. But she will remember how she felt at Hive, being brave, making new friends and trying new things. And she'll feel pretty proud of herself doing the same at home!



Lanakila Barnes Boffey

Counselors, as well as campers, sometimes learn hard lessons at camp. Here are some excerpts from a letter written to me by a young counselor who several years ago violated one of our “absolutes”—rules of camp behavior that are simply not negotiable. His use of marijuana in the counselor social scene led to his dismissal, and his departure represented a real defeat for him. His request to return and “make it right” was one which demanded courage and vulnerability.

Dear Barnes,

I can't tell you how scared I've been to write this letter. I can't tell you how many nights I've spent thinking about Lanakila. It seems like a lifetime ago that I found myself packing my bags and driving away from Fairlee, Vermont for what I was sure would be the last time. As I sit here I'm filled with nothing but fear; fear that I won't be able to convey to you how much I've changed, fear that even if I am able, that it won't make a difference, but most of all, fear that even if I were to return to camp, the place would be changed for me. There is no doubt that I let everyone down, and yet my hope still rests in the fact that the place I love more than anything in the world will one day be able to forgive me. I know I don't deserve a second chance, and I can't claim that I'm a new man, but I will always be the man that Lanakila made me.

I learned a lot about myself two summers ago, even if I didn't know it at the time. And here I come to my one hope, that I can prove to you that I am so very much more aware of who I am and what I need to do and that spending two years away from Lanakila has shown me that there are few things in life that mean more to me, or are more important, than Lanakila...

...If you are ever willing to give me another shot, whether it be this summer, or any summer in the future, I promise that I will never do anything that would compromise my integrity, or the integrity of Camp Lanakila. I promise that upon my return I would do whatever it takes to earn back the trust of everyone...But most importantly I promise to be the best counselor I can possibly be.

Failure can be debilitating to some, but in the right environment it can be a spark to greatness. Lanakila has always been a “place of second chances” for both counselors and campers. There are so many challenges and failures we help young people face with dignity, compassion, courage and support. Camp is a place to learn to get back up again when you get knocked down. I believed this counselor looked deeply inside himself, as Lanakila had taught him to do, and was sincere in his commitment to return to camp honorably. I hired him back the following summer and he did an absolutely wonderful and trustworthy job.

Hulbert Outdoor Center Brendan Madden



This fall at Hulbert, we convened the Hulbert Women's Leadership Advisory Panel. The panel is composed of a wide range of women, leaders in their fields, from executives to therapists, leadership consultants to educators, most with an Aloha connection. It is a remarkable group, and the panel has been helping us shape the educational philosophy of the Young Women's Leadership Expedition. This educational adventure will premiere in July 2011, on a white water canoe expedition in the wilderness of Quebec, Canada. The Advisory Panel is also helping us ensure that the curriculum of the course balances cutting edge leadership theory, with the century-old Aloha tradition of helping young women find their most adventurous selves.

We chose a wilderness canoe expedition as the medium for this course, because the challenges of the great outdoors offer a perfect opportunity to learn experientially the value and process of collaborative problem solving. In a fun, caring, and uniquely feminine atmosphere, our students will practice approaching real-world problems and their consequences. They will have a chance to practice different leadership styles and problem-solving techniques, and receive feedback from their teachers and peers. Our graduates will find different challenges in their paths throughout their lives: as community leaders, executives, professionals and parents...but the teamwork and leadership skills they learn in the wilderness will serve them all well. In the words of longtime Hulbert leader Deb Williams, our goal is to “raise young women who are brave, assertive, and willing to stand up for themselves!”



Horizons Tracey McFadden

For many of our youngest campers, Horizons is their first camp experience. For them, Horizons is full of many exciting new opportunities and challenges. For every camper the challenges are different. One child's challenge may be swimming in a lake when he is only used to a pool. Another may find that performing at assembly with her group is outside her comfort zone. A camper might need to push himself physically to reach the top of a mountain on a hike. A shy child may find it difficult to form new friendships. At Horizons, each of these personal challenges is seen not as a problem, but as an opportunity for growth.

Sometimes one of the most valuable lessons can be learning how to handle disappointment when things don't turn out as expected. Frequently a camper may sign up for his first summer at Horizons with a good buddy from school, only to arrive at camp on the first day to discover that he is not in the same group with his friend. For some campers, this disappointment can be very upsetting. Often, a new camper's vision of camp included a safe friend by their side; and without a friend, the new setting of Horizons can feel scary. Campers and parents may believe the solution is to "fix" the "problem" by switching friends into the same group. At Horizons though, we see this situation as an opportunity for a child to learn how to be their best self, even when facing disappointment. With ample help and support from counselors, a child can branch out and gain the confidence and skills to build new friendships.

Our goal at Horizons is not to create a perfect world for our campers, or fix their problems, but to help children realize that they can be successful and have fun, even when faced with challenges and difficulties.



Ohana Andy Williams

Ohana Camp has many kinds of visitors, from families with children, to couples, and seniors, including participants in hiking and canoeing programs for women in their 50s, 60s and older. Before they set out on their wilderness adventures, I tell them a story about a trip I took with three colleagues: a December traverse of Baxter State Park to the summit of Mount Katahdin in northern Maine. We spent the better part of a week hiking north to south through the park. Although the hiking proved to be fairly easy, as the week progressed, the temperatures dropped well below zero and the snow began to accumulate. On our fifth day, we camped at Chimney Pond, the point from which we would attempt our Katahdin summit. That evening we sat together and worked through the details for the next day. We would rise early, well before sunrise, and begin our climb with head lamps. We also committed to a turnaround time of 1:00 pm, no matter where we were on the mountain, as we knew we needed to be off the mountain and back in camp before dark.

We rose that morning to subzero temperatures and windblown snow. The early part of our hike was the steepest, and proved to be the most difficult, with waist-deep, windblown drifts, that slowed our progress. We climbed slowly toward the summit, breaking trail as we progressed. We completed the most difficult part of our climb by late morning, and then confidently headed toward the top, enjoying easier hiking. As we approached Katahdin's summit, not much more than 200 yards away, 1:00 pm appeared on our snow covered watches. We stopped, regrouped, looked back at the mountain we had covered over the past eight hours, and ahead to the short distance remaining to the summit. Without hesitation, we acknowledged our commitment to our 1:00 PM turnaround time, turned around and headed back to camp. It would have been easy to allow ourselves a little leeway. We *might* very well have successfully reached the summit, and safely made it back to camp before dark. But, to a person, we all knew that we had just practiced what we each had so often preached; make a plan and stick to it. The lessons are in the process and the journey, not just in the goal. A point that is so often lost along the way.



Note from the Treasurer Peter Gaillard

2010 was a very solid year for The Aloha Foundation across many fronts, including the financial one. Tuition revenues were up 7% over 2009, led by better than anticipated enrollment at both Hive and Aloha. Lanakila continued its trend of full enrollment, and Ohana Camp had a better-than-plan summer as well.

The Annual Fund was up 12% over last year's record giving. Total giving in 2010, including the Annual Fund, restricted gifts and bequests was more than \$842,000—a great accomplishment, and a testament to the commitment the greater Aloha family has to the Foundation.

Our endowment continued to rebound from the 2008 lows—returning 11% for the year. The total value of the portfolio at year end was more than \$11.2 million, which is the highest it has ever been. The Foundation also ended the year with an operating surplus—a combination of better than expected enrollment and prudent management of expenses combining for that happy result. The year was not without some financial surprises, including the total loss in July of the Lanakila/Hulbert ropes course from a microburst thunderstorm. (The course was rebuilt 'bigger and better' in time for the Hulbert season—and, since covered under our insurance policy, partially paid for by insurance.)

While 2010 was a strong year for the Foundation (and 2011 is off to an excellent start), we remain committed to careful financial stewardship, so that The Aloha Foundation can continue to serve many generations of campers to come.

Giving 2010

The Foundation was very generously supported by friends, both old and new, during 2010. The Annual Fund, building on last year's success, set a fresh record, raising \$363,175 in unrestricted gifts from 798 donors. Restricted gifts, including support for Ohana's first Vermont National Guard Family Camp, for the families of Guard members deployed to Afghanistan; and the tremendous response from the Lanakila community for the new Director's Cabin, reached \$479,100, bringing total new gifts to \$842,275 for the year. In addition, more than \$47,000 in new pledges were recorded, all to be paid in 2011 in support of the Lanakila Director's Cabin.

Perhaps the best news of all is the number of first time donors supporting the camps. This year 217 new donors contributed \$91,420 for all purposes. Almost half were young Lanakilans answering the call to support the staff-inspired Director's Cabin.

We recognize donors who have contributed to The Aloha Foundation regularly for at least five consecutive years with the mark of the Kanaka (☛) a figure that represents the spirit in nature in the Hawaiian culture, which Mother and Father Gulick loved and commemorated. Continuous giving by so many alums and friends ensures our ability to promote the Gulicks' vision for Aloha long into the future.
